Australian Troops in WW1:

The Beginning, Locations and Aftermath.

Anzacs fought at Gallipoli, in France, Belgium and the Middle East, in mud, on horses and on camels. With the introduction of planes and tanks, the battle focus changed. Shell shock, loss of limbs and gassing became major occurrences. With the death of over 60,000 Australians at Armistice, the impact on all aspects of Australian society did not end when the guns fell silent.

This presentation will visit the locations where the Anzacs fought, the battle outcomes and the significant effect on the Australians at home. It will also list the resources that can be used to find out more about your WW1 relative's service.

The Gladesville Mental Hospital was formerly known as the Tarban Creek Lunatic Asylum. It was a psychiatric hospital established in 1838.

We'll take the train to Town Hall then, after coffee, the bus from Park St. to Gladesville. There will be a seven minute downhill walk to meet our guide at Banjo's Restaurant, an 1830's stone cottage overlooking the Parramatta River where bush poet and journalist Banjo Patterson once lived.








Writer's Interest Group
